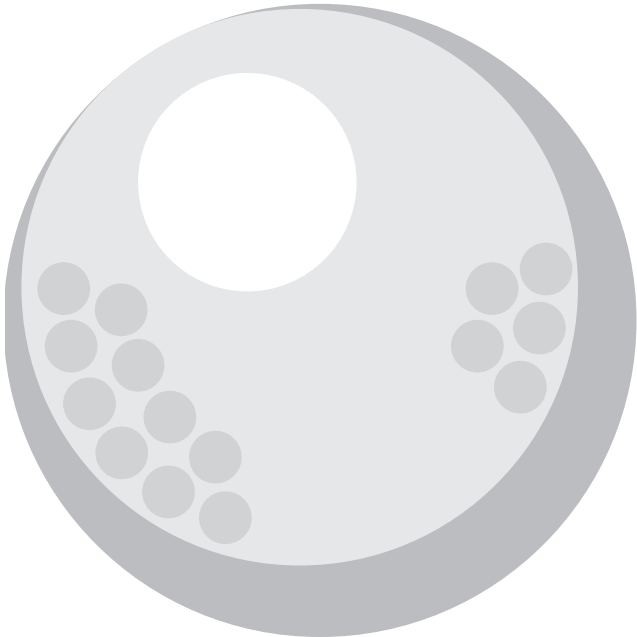


# Sports recap:boys



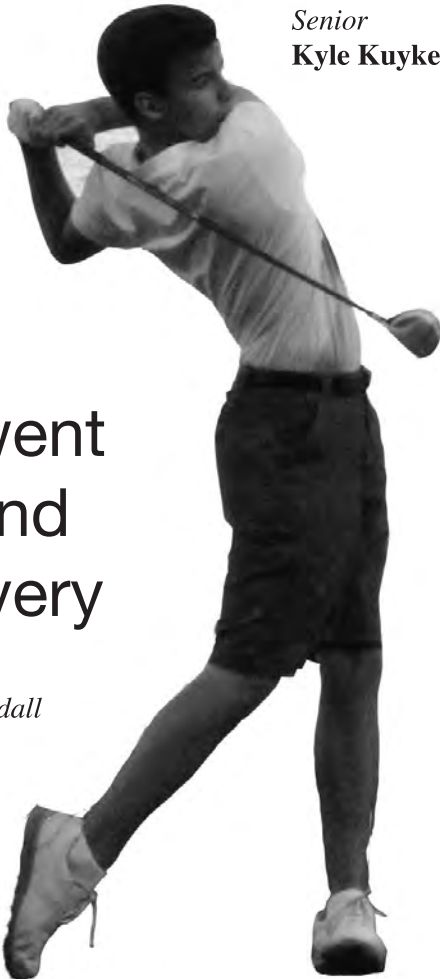

“I didn’t know any of the people going into the season except for one or two because they were mostly sophomores or

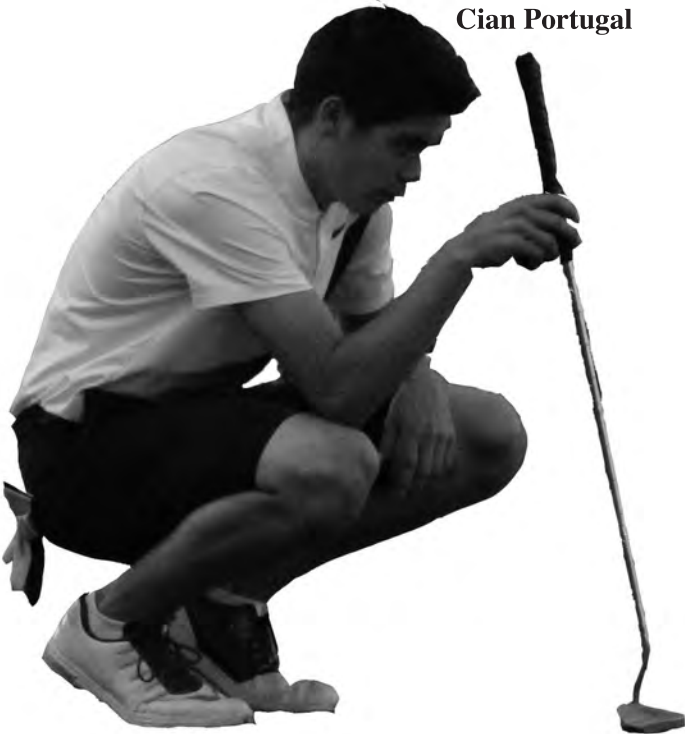
freshmen, but I really liked how we came together as a team,” Kuykendall said.
